
## Re: Australian Pollinator Week 11 – 19 November 2023



Australian Pollinator Week (APW) is a celebration of the pollinators found in Australia that are play a vital role in plant reproduction; including ensuring supplies of many important food crops.

Honey bees (Apis *mellifera*) are the most important pollinators; with an estimated 81 million hives

around the World. Other species of insect (including wasps, butterflies and beetles), as well as many bird species also play important roles as pollinators.



Unfortunately, pollinators are in decline the world over; not only bees but, also, insects in general. This is due to the overuse of agrochemicals, habitat loss, introduction of invasive species, and climate change.
