# Response to the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

### Introduction

Household Options to Protect the Environment (HOPE) welcomes the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, recognising its alignment with HOPE's long-standing advocacy for the Earth Charter and multiple UN-led sustainability initiatives, including the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). This response outlines our position, identifies opportunities for collaboration, and provides recommendations to enhance implementation, particularly at the household and community levels.

# **Alignment with HOPE's Mission**

The 2030 Agenda's emphasis on people, planet, prosperity, peace, and partnership aligns closely with HOPE's values and operational focus. HOPE's commitment to fostering environmentally responsible households and communities complements the SDGs' integrated approach to environmental, social, and economic sustainability.

## Recommendations

Based on the review of the 2030 Agenda, HOPE recommends the following actions:

- 1. Strengthen Localised Implementation of SDGs Encourage local governments and community organisations to adapt the SDGs to regional priorities, focusing on achievable household-level actions (SDG 11, SDG 12).
- 2. Promote Sustainable Consumption and Production Develop education and outreach programs that encourage households to reduce waste, adopt circular economy practices, and support sustainable supply chains (SDG 12).
- 3. Support Climate Action through Community Resilience Enhance local adaptation strategies to climate-related risks, including heatwaves, flooding, and biodiversity loss, with household preparedness plans and resource-efficient infrastructure (SDG 13, SDG 15).
- 4. Enhance Data Collection at Community Level Collaborate with citizen science initiatives to collect local environmental data, feeding into national reporting systems to ensure 'no one is left behind' (SDG 17).
- 5. Promote Environmental Education and Behaviour Change Leverage the Earth Charter principles to strengthen community understanding of interconnected global challenges and inspire positive environmental action (SDG 4).

# **Glossary**

SDGs – Sustainable Development Goals, a set of 17 global goals adopted by the UN in 2015 to be achieved by 2030.

Earth Charter – A declaration of fundamental principles for building a just, sustainable, and peaceful global society.

Circular Economy – An economic system aimed at eliminating waste and continually reusing resources.

Citizen Science – Scientific research conducted, in whole or in part, by amateur or non-professional scientists.
